



'James Glassford Esqr. Sheriff of Dumbartonshire' James Glassford Esq. of Douglaston (1771 – 1845)

James Glassford was a Scottish legal writer and traveller. Son of John Glassford of Douglaston, he was admitted a member of the Faculty of Advocates in 1793, and became sheriff-depute of Dumbartonshire. Glassford was one of the commissioners of the Royal Commission of inquiry into the state of education in Ireland, visiting Ulster, Leinster, and Munster in 1824, and Connaught in 1826.

Representative Peer for Scotland 1790-1815, Lord Lieutenant of Renfrewshire 1810-20, and of Ayrshire 1820; Lord Rector of Glasgow University 1817-19

'Sir John Graham of Braco Bart.'

The Graham of Braco Baronetcy was extinct by 1700, and this is most likely the seal of 'John Graham of Grenada' whose business partner was David Graeme of Braco Castle (1716 – 1797)
